Maine Violent Death Reporting System

- Funded in 2014, with our first year of data collection in 2015
- Collects data on all deaths resulting from violence as well as unintentional firearm injuries
- As of the 2020 data year, all 50 states, DC and PR are funded
- Currently have data for 2015 to 2023
 - Maine VDRS is housed at the Office of Chief Medical Examiner who contracts with the University of Maine for project administration and staffing

Maine Violent Death Reporting System

- Has over 650 variables that can be collected
 - Basic demographic information
 - Weapon information
 - Circumstances
 - Collected from Medical Examiner, Law Enforcement, and Death Certificates
- Limitations
 - Secondary data collection
 - Accuracy of death certificates

Occupations

- Gathered from death certificate
- Construction and Trades
 - Laborers, carpenters, plumbers, electricians, welders, etc.
- Medical Professionals
 - Doctors, nurses, CNAs, CRMAs
- First Responders
 - Law enforcement, corrections, marine patrol, game wardens


